## The Project-Based Mental Health Therapist job at a glance

### General Summary

Under the supervision of the Clinical Supervisor with clinical oversight provided by the FWB Manager or designee, the Project-Based Mental Health Therapist-NE provides mental health services (consultation or therapy) as required by contract. The PB MHT-NE provides services such as individual/ family therapy and/or clinical consultation for the duration of the funding, set to conclude on June 30, 2026. The PB MHT-NE maintains current and accurate documentation of services as required by contract. The PB MHT-NE operates within the current best practices of the Mental Health field and adheres to Board of Behavioral Sciences (BBS) or Board of Psychology (BOP) legal/ethical standards, State regulations, and Agency policy.

## The Details of the Job:

### Essential Duties And Responsibilities

Within a team environment, this position will perform the following responsibilities:

#### ▪ Provide Services to enrolled recipients (60%)

- Services may include individual/ family therapy to adults/children and/or mental health consultation with early childhood educators/caregivers utilizing appropriate treatment models/modalities based on initial intake and assessment. Services may be in the office, in family homes, and may occasionally be virtual.
- Complete required initial intake assessments/screenings.
- In consultation with FWB Director or designee, provide immediate, clinical assessment and intervention of potential 5150/5585 (involuntary hospitalization) situations.

- Maintain documentation of all services provided to assigned clients/families/early childhood educators in accordance with program and agency timelines.
- **Individualized Child and Family Centered Consultation (20%)**
  - Provide and maintain compliant documentation of clinical consultation to internal partners on topics such as, but not limited to, mandated reporting (child/elder/dependent adult) questions, age-appropriate behavioral interventions, Danger to Self (DTS) and Danger to Others (DTO) assessments.
  - Provide and maintain compliant documentation of consultation and client needs and create or follow-up on plans to support these needs.
- **Community Referrals (10%)**
  - Provide and maintain documentation of referrals and linkages to assigned clients to meet identified needs, including but not limited to: longer term therapeutic services, therapeutic needs beyond the scope/level of care of program the client is enrolled in , basic needs (food, clothing, shelter, safety), etc.
- **Other: (10%)**
  - Participate in Reflective Supervision with FWB Director or designee.
  - Participate in team meetings as directed by Program Manager
  - Participate in administrative supervision with Program Manager
  - Contribute to federal, state, and local reporting requirements.
  - Comply with CA Mandated Child Abuse, Elder Abuse and Dependent Adult Abuse Reporting Laws
  - Complete all related documentation within contract and Agency deadlines.
  - Maintain proper confidentiality/HIPAA compliance procedures when handling records and information
  - Develop and maintain well-defined lines of communication and professional boundaries

## Non-Essential Duties And Responsibilities

These duties include tasks that are required and comprise less than 5% of daily functions for this job:

- Keep up to date with child development, trauma informed care and mental health literature, research, and trends in the business and politics of early care and education.
- For Unlicensed staff: complete 18 hours of continuing education training in areas related to infant/family/early childhood mental health, each program year.
- Prepare oral and written reports as needed.
- Other duties as assigned.

## Job Specifications

### Minimum Required

- a. **Education:** Master's or Doctoral Degree in psychology, social work, or related and **license-eligible** in the State of California through the BBS or BOP;
- b. Experience:
  - Minimum of 1 year of direct experience providing therapy to adults, couples, families and children in a clinic-based or private practice setting. Experience gained during practicum training will be considered.
  - Minimum of 1 year of experience, working with children birth to five and their families in any capacity (teaching, mental health, school, center, day care, etc.).
  - Knowledge of trauma informed care, ACEs/PEARLs, mental health and developmental issues with children 0-5 years.
- c. Professional/Technical Certifications:
  - Must be license-eligible in the State of CA (AMFT, ACSW) – and registered with the California Board of Behavioral Sciences (BBS)); must maintain current CA BBS registration in good standing for the duration of employment.
  - Maintain First Aid & CPR certification.

- **Technical Requirements:**
  - Computer skills; including Electronic Health Records for assessment and documentation of services, web browsing, e-mail, data entry, and word processing. Proficiency in Windows-based programs including Microsoft Outlook, Word, and Excel.
- **Bilingual Required:** Ability to converse, write and/or translate in English and Spanish (LA county)
- **Behavioral:**
  - Must have ability to follow oral and written directions.
  - Must have ability to establish and maintain cooperative, diplomatic working relationships with co-workers, families, and the community to work as part of a team.
  - Adherence to confidentiality, including HIPAA and PHI, in accordance with Agency policy and legal requirements.
  - Adherence technological security in accordance with Agency policy and legal requirements.
- **Travel:** Some travel/business related driving required; Staff may choose any mode of transportation (driving, walking, bicycling, carpooling, etc) to arrive to and depart from the location where attendance is required. Should a staff member choose to drive, the staff member must become an approved driver with CCRC prior to driving on behalf of CCRC. Approved drivers driving on behalf of CCRC may choose to drive a CCRC vehicle or own vehicle and must meet requirements to be an approved driver including holding and maintaining current auto insurance, current California Driver's License and receiving DMV clearance.
- **Work Schedule:** Full time, typically M-F, ability to at times work a non-traditional work schedule including early mornings, late evenings and weekends.
- **Work environment:** Mixture of working in an office work environment and working directly with the community; hybrid

- **Background & Health Clearance Requirements:** Background requirements determined according to the requirements of the program(s) which the position will be supporting. Background check required. As a grant-funded Agency supporting Children and Family Services, CCRC conducts background checks commensurate with the role to verify candidate qualifications (criminal history, employment history / experience, education, reference checks) and ensure grant compliance. Specific roles may have additional verification / clearance to the standard background check as part of the recruitment and selection process, including:
  - **Live Scan Clearance / DOJ Fingerprinting:** For positions working directly with the public in a child/ community care or child / community care adjacent setting (CA Health and Safety Code Section 1596.871 and/or Head Start Program Performance Standards 1302.90).
  - **Health Clearance:** For positions working directly with the public in a child/ community care or child / community care adjacent setting or working with "at risk" populations, CA Code of Regulations Title 22, §101216, CA Health and Safety Code 1596.7995, and/or Head Start Program Performance Standards 1302.93)
  - **MVR / DMV clearance** in accordance with CCRC's liability insurance provisions: For positions where driving is required.
  - **Child Development Permit:** For positions working in an educational capacity (California Education Code Sections 44242.5, 44340, and 44341)
  - **CPR / Pediatric CPR certification:** For certain identified positions working directly with the public in a child/ community care or child / community care adjacent setting (CA Health & Safety Code 1596.865 – 1596.866)
  - **Federal Debarment Checks:** For positions acting in a principal capacity to federal funds (Head Start Program Performance Standards 1304.11, Code of Federal Regulations Title 2 Grants and Agreements 2.180.320 and 2.180.995)
  - **Credit & Bankruptcy Check:** For positions with fiscal responsibility (roles with authority over financial transactions), a credit and bankruptcy check will be conducted to assess financial

responsibility in alignment with agency standards and applicable laws, including the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act (15 U.S.C. 1681 et seq.) and California Labor Code restrictions on credit reports (Labor Code 1025.5.)
