Head Start supports low income children from birth to age 5 through early learning, development, health, and other services to help prepare them to excel in the school system and in life. Parents are also actively engaged in the program leading to strong child outcomes and improved financial stability.

All children receive health and developmental screenings. Of those screened, over 300 recieve early intervention services before kindergarten, typically in the areas of Speech and Language Impairment, Developmental Delay, or Autism.

Call to Action

The positive results described above are impossible to achieve without adequate funding. Head Start is a placed-based system of care where children and families receive community supportive services and experience well-being. This whole child and family approach is provided in a trusted environment that sets a trajectory for lifetime outcomes. Additionally, Head Start employs over 230,000 direct service jobs across the nation as well as tens of thousands of support positions. These jobs support families and communities. Finally, 86% of rural communities have a Head Start program that is at times the only care option in that community.² Fully funding Head Start ensures parents and children thrive and supports hundreds of thousands of jobs, and therefore the nation's economy.
